Pastor's Note

Dear Ones,

What or who do you grasp so tightly that you cannot imagine letting go? How about what people think of you? What if you took a risk and set aside your reputation by showing your neighbors who you really are? Letting people around you know that you are a follower of Jesus could be a wonderful and affirming (by your neighbors) experience or it could expose you to indifference or worse reputational damage.

Loving your neighbor enough to tell them who you really are and who Jesus is to you is risky because it is a way to love. Love always demands a response and you and I cannot control the response of others when we love them.

Nevertheless, it is precisely in those moments of costly risk that Jesus becomes most dear to us. Are you a bit cold spiritually? Does your life lack spiritual power? Maybe you and I are grasping onto something other than Jesus and have become so risk averse, faith means little to us.

Count the cost, but take the risk.

Luke 14:25-33

²⁵Now great crowds accompanied him, and he turned and said to them, ²⁶" If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. ²⁷Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. ²⁸For which of you, desiring to build a tower, does not first sit down and count the cost, whether he has enough to complete it? ²⁹Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it begin to mock him, ³⁰saying, 'This man began to build and was not able to finish.' ³¹Or what king, going out to encounter another king in war, will not sit down first and deliberate whether he is able with ten thousand to meet him who comes against him with twenty thousand? ³²And if not, while the other is yet a great way off, he sends a delegation and asks for terms of peace. ³³So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple.

Preparation for the Lord's Supper

Words of Institution

Then came the day of Unleavened Bread on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, "Go and make preparations for us to eat the Passover." When the hour came, Jesus and His apostles reclined at the table. And He said to them, "I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. For I tell you, I will not eat it again until it finds fulfillment in the kingdom of God." After taking the cup, He gave thanks and said, "Take this and divide it among you. For I tell you I will not drink again of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes." And He took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body given for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after the supper He took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you." "And I assign to you, as my Father assigned to me, a kingdom, that you may eat and drink at my table in my kingdom."

Confession of Sin

Doxology

What does "doxology" mean? It's derived from two Greek words meaning "glory" and "word." A doxology, then, is a spoken word or song that ascribes glory to God. Today's doxology calls all of creation to praise God as the source of all blessing and acknowledges His Trinitarian (three-in-one) nature.
