



### A Worship Study Guide for Individuals, Groups and Families: For the week of July 29, 2018

Note to Discussion Leaders: Have members read the Bible passage in the group meeting. This is a "worship discussion" guide, and our reflections and applications are grounded in Scripture. Read through this guide before meeting with the group. You do <u>not</u> need to work through the whole guide. Decide which points would be most helpful for the time of meeting together, and use them as a starting point for your time together.

# Numbers 35:1-35 "Cities of Refuge"

This week, Steve Shelby preached on Numbers 35:1-35.

- A number of principles arise out of this text.
- The necessity and provision of shepherding/pastoral care for Israel in the scattering of the Levites
- The irony of the Levites living in the Cities of Refuge
- Genesis 34 & 49
- The value of life
- Provisions for accidental/unintentional murder
- "As when someone goes into the forest with his neighbor to cut wood, and his hand swings the axe to cut down a tree, and the head slips from the handle and strikes his neighbor so that he dies—he may flee to one of these cities and live" (Deuteronomy 19:5)
- The necessity of a death for the cleansing of the land where God lives
- The cleansing work of a death for the unintentional death of someone
- The kinsman-redeemer-avenger
- "Then after he is sold he may be redeemed. One of his brothers may redeem him." (Leviticus 25:48)
- "Remain tonight, and in the morning, if he will redeem you, good; let him do it. But if he is not willing to redeem you, then, as the Lord lives, I will redeem you. Lie down until the morning." (Ruth 3:13)

## Going Deeper in God's Worship

#### Reflect on the text together. Hear the sermon here.

- 1.) What is true about God's character, promises or work?
- 2.) What does the Scripture teach you about yourself or others?
- 3.) Are you encouraged to follow Jesus in His mission? How?

#### Reflect on the whole of Sunday's liturgy together. Locate this week's Order of Worship here.

- 1.) Was there an element of the worship service that you would like to share with the group?
  - A Scripture verse that was read?
  - A prayer that was prayed?
  - A song that was sung?
  - A sacrament that was administered?
  - A way that glory was given to God?
  - A way that someone encouraged you?
- 2.) Did the Holy Spirit convict, change, or encourage you in any way you wish to share with the group?
- 3.) Is Jesus leading you or the group to take a specific risk to minister the Good News to Richmond? Your neighbors? Your co-workers? Your family and friends?

## **Going Further in Christ's Mission**

- 1.) Have the Scripture text open in front of you as a guide to your prayers.
  - Spend time thanking God and giving Him glory.
- 2.) Ask the Lord for vision, strength and faith as followers of Jesus Christ.
  - Count on the work of the Holy Spirit for change.
  - Ask for God's forgiveness and grace to repent of sin and trust Jesus.
  - Pray for the world, our country, Richmond, and the Church.
  - Pray for members of your group, family members, or co-workers, neighbors and friends.
