# A Worship Study Guide for Individuals, Groups and Families for the week of May 26, 2019

## The Helper

This week, Joe Brown preached on John 14:23-29

<sup>23</sup> Jesus answered him, "If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. <sup>24</sup> Whoever does not love me does not keep my words. And the word that you hear is not mine but the Father's who sent me. <sup>25</sup> "These things I have spoken to you while I am still with you. <sup>26</sup> But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you. <sup>27</sup> Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid. <sup>28</sup> You heard me say to you, 'I am going away, and I will come to you.' If you loved me, you would have rejoiced, because I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. <sup>29</sup> And now I have told you before it takes place, so that when it does take place you may believe.

- It's pretty dire in the upper room. Jesus teaches (<u>John 13:31-35</u>) about His betrayal, execution, death, and resurrection; His union between Jesus and the Father; The fact that He is leaving and they can't follow; But they must instead love one another through obedience and service, and this will identify you as a follower of Christ.
- Jesus is speaking to a group of disciples who are barely holding it together, in the face of persecution, and don't understand what God is doing.
- Jesus, speaking truth in order to encourage, promises the disciples something: "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever, even the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, for he dwells with you and will be in you. I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you." (John 14:15-18)
- Jesus speaking to His despondent followers, sees them in their concern, and loves them to the end. The content of these final chapters of
  John (and the entire Bible) is that Christianity is about "abiding in Christ," our union with Him. "Being in Christ, and united to Him, is the
  fundamental constitution of a Christian." (Thomas Goodwin)
- Anyone who believes in Jesus is spiritually united with Him. Our salvation, growth in discipleship, and glorification are all because of our
  union with Christ. Spiritual disciplines (or means of grace) are ways that we, in responding to the Gospel, abide in Him. Without Christ, we
  are severed from God dead sticks on the ground. "Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in
  the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me." (John 15:4)
- The disciples were facing the real immediate threat of their faith being demolished. The help that the disciples needed was beyond kindness and lifting up those around them. Here and now, for them, kindness would evaporate.
- What is your need today? "32 years ago, our family was undergoing a crisis. I received a long, compassionate letter from a friend on the
  West Coast. Although the letter was wonderful, one line bothered me. My friend wrote, 'Your spirituality will get you through this.' When I
  read it, I recoiled. Whatever 'spirituality' meant, I was keenly aware that I didn't have any of it. In and of myself, I had nothing adequate for
  what was facing us at the time. I had only the faithfulness of Jesus Christ." (Fleming Rutledge)
- "Do you know, O saint, how much the Holy Spirit loves you? Can you measure the love of the Spirit? Do you know how great is the affection of his soul toward you? Go measure heaven with your span; go weigh the mountains in the scales; go take the ocean's water, and tell each drop; go count the sand upon the sea's wide shore; and when you have accomplished this, you can tell how much he loves you. He has loved you long, he has loved you well, he has loved you from the beginning, and he still shall love you forever; surely he is the person to comfort you, because he loves. Admit him, then, to your heart, O Christian, that he may comfort you in your distress." (Charles Spurgeon)
- The Holy Spirit comes alongside all who believe in Jesus in order to help us. And He helps us by pointing us to Jesus and by bringing Jesus to us. "The typical relationship between believers and the Holy Spirit in today's church is too often like that between the husband and wife in a bad marriage. They live under the same roof, and the husband makes constant use of his wife's services, but he fails to communicate with her, recognize her presence and celebrate his relationship with her." (Richard Lovelace, Dynamics of Spiritual Life, 131)
- The Holy Spirit / The Helper / The Paraclete is: Faithful, Unwearied, Wise, Safe, Active, Ever-Present
- Who helps you? "He comes to us from the heart of Christ, the bearer of Christ's life, the revealer and communicator of Christ Himself within us." (Andrew Murray)
